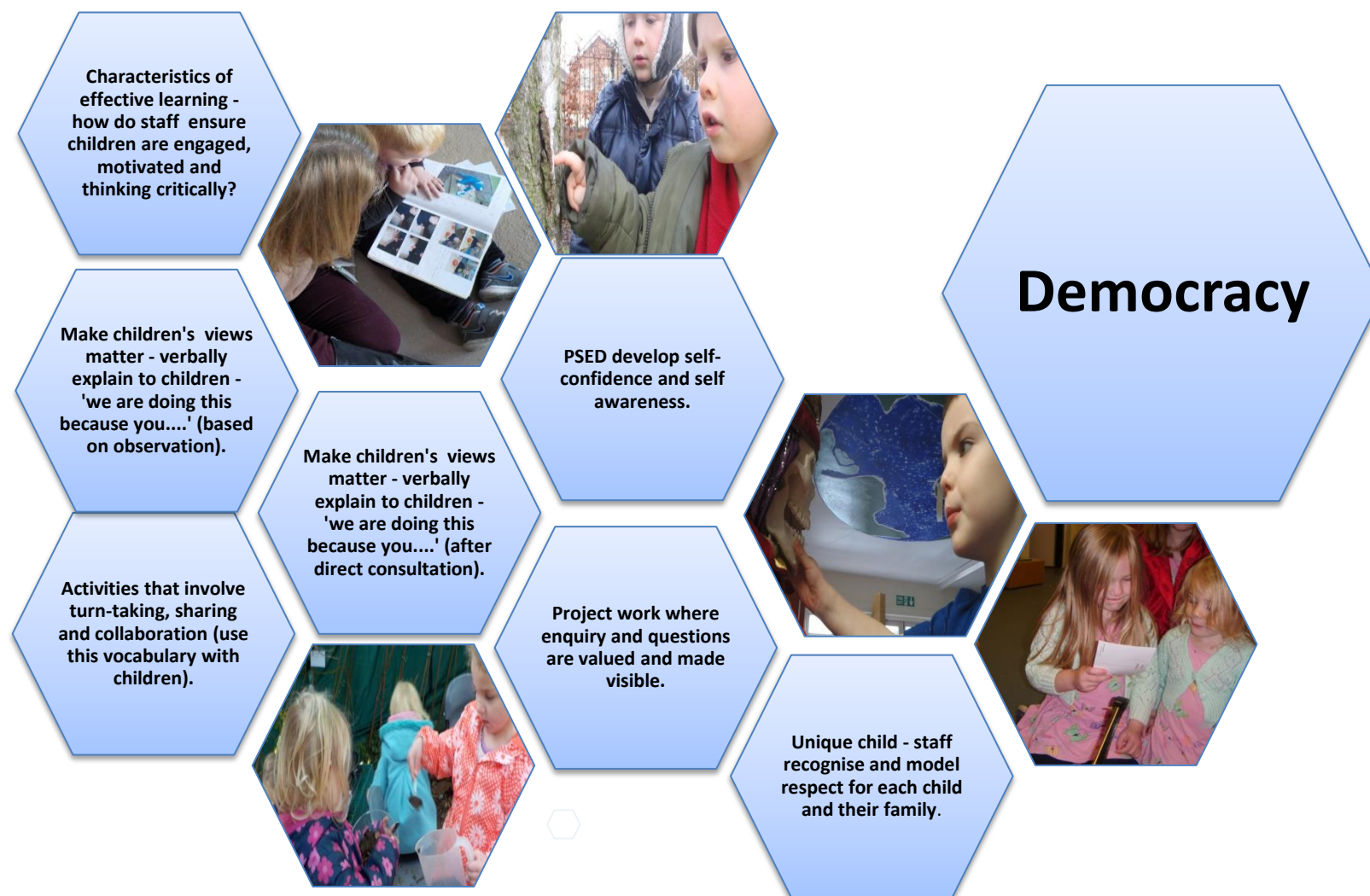


How we promote British values at Madeley Nursery School



PSED – Personal, social and emotional development is an area of the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum.

Individual liberty; freedom for all

Take time to encourage children to resolve conflict.

PSED - focus on self-confidence and self-awareness.

UTW - develop awareness of people and communities. Staff develop their own knowledge as well as that of children.

Focus on managing feelings and behaviour.

Develop the vocabulary of feelings and responsibility enabling children to reflect on differences and understand we have different opinions.

Allow children to take risks and try out new ideas - for example during outdoor play.

Give children appropriate praise for social, behavioural or learning qualities so that they begin to recognise success in themselves and others.

Through enquiry projects encourage children to discuss together to listen, respond, agree and disagree so they can recognise everyone has different opinions.

UTW – Understanding the world is an area of the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum.

Rule of Law

Use stories that show how characters help and support each other.



PSED - develops understanding that rules matter and enable us to be together.

Take time to encourage children to resolve conflict.

Focus on managing feelings and behaviour.



Develop the vocabulary of feelings and emotions.

Develop the understanding that behaviours have consequences.



Staff work together with children to create rules and codes of behaviour and that they apply to everyone.

Offer experiences and talk positively about the emergency services including the police.

Mutual respect and tolerance of different faiths and beliefs

Ethos for the whole school of inclusivity and tolerance of different views, faiths, cultures and races.

PSED - develops ability to manage feelings and behaviours and make relationships.

Focus on managing feelings and behaviour.

Use stories that show how characters help and support each other.

Staff role model an inclusive attitude to different faiths, cultures and beliefs.

Provide resources and activities that challenge, gender, cultural and racial stereotyping.

Involve the children in the wider community including visiting places of worship.

Work in partnership with parents to share knowledge and experiences.
